Last week our Stars were




Ella and Liliana

Ideas for supporting learning at home

Exploring minibeasts

- Take your child on a 'minibeast hunt' in the garden or in the park. How many different insects can you find? Can you name them? What do they look like? How do they move? (slither, crawl etc.) How many legs do they have?

Numerals in the environment

- We are encouraging the children to notice numerals in their everyday lives. Point out numerals on buses, car number plates, in the supermarket, etc.

During the sessions we will be discussing the feeling of frustration and talking about frustrating situations. We will introduce strategies for managing feelings of frustration:
