Home Learning

Numeracy

Please encourage and support your child's learning of number by asking them questions such as; How many....? What number can you see? Can you find....? I have 3 objects, how many do you have? I had 7, I lost some and now I have 4. How many did I lose? Can you give me $\frac{2}{4}$ / $\frac{1}{6}$ more? etc.

Literacy

Explore rhythm and rhyme with your child through rhyming stories such as, *Where's My Teddy?* and *Brown Bear, Brown Bear What do you see?* Continue to practise the initial sounds (m,a,s,t,d,i,p,n,g,o) learnt thus far with your child by encouraging them to tell you the initial sound of things they see on their walk home, objects around the home or words they hear in stories.
